How to find services within the State of Texas

Aging and Disability Resource Centers (ADRC)

- ADRCs provide help for older adults and persons with disabilities in accessing resources to assist with long term care.
- Streamline access to Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) and provide a one stop shop for disability related resources.
- Services Include:
 - Benefits Assistance help applying for services such as SSI or other public or private benefits
 - Housing Navigation help identifying appropriate, accessible, and affordable housing options
 - Service Navigation screening for needs and direction to appropriate services
 - Options Counseling guidance and decision support about long term care services
 - ▶ Respite Support for Caregivers information, referral, and assistance for respite support
- Located across all 254 counties in Texas, statewide hotline is 1-855-YES-ADRC or 1-855-937-2372

Medical Care

- Whether you have Medicaid, private insurance, or are uninsured, it is important to have access to medical care through a Primary Care Provider (PCP).
- With adults, primary care providers, rather than specialists, typically maintain the responsibility of ordering any supplies for patients, such as incontinence supplies, feeding supplies, or durable medical equipment.
- For those without insurance or Medicaid benefits, medical care is available through the County Indigent Health Care Program.
 - Offers primary, preventative, and some specialty services
 - Available to Texas residents with an income at or below 21% of the federal poverty level who aren't eligible for Medicaid.

Employment Services


- ► Texas Workforce Commission Vocational Rehabilitation Services
 - Provides services for people with disabilities to prepare for, obtain, maintain, or advance in employment.
 - Disabilities served:
 - Vison related disabilities
 - Physical disabilities
 - ▶ Behavioral and mental health conditions
 - ▶ Intellectual, learning, or developmental disabilities
 - ► Alcoholism or drug addiction

Mental Health Services

- Local Mental Health Authority (LMHA)- Contracted agencies across Texas to provide mental and behavioral health services to the community, usually designated by county.
 - Local LMHA's accept both insured and uninsured patients for services. If uninsured, they will assist you in completing a financial assessment.
 - Services include
 - Crisis Services
 - Counseling
 - Medication Management/Psychiatric Services
 - Case Management
 - Addiction Services and Treatment

STAR Plus+ Waiver Services

- ► The STAR Plus+ Waiver is Medicaid coverage for persons ages 21+ receiving SSI benefits. Members on STAR Kids Medicaid will transition to STAR Plus+ the month after their 21st birthday.
- As a STAR Plus+ member, you can have a named service coordinator to assist you with finding services and doctors.
- ➤ You will be assigned to a Managed Care Organization (MCO) based on where you live. There are typically 2 MCOs to choose from per region. Changes can be made by calling 1-800-964-2777



Medicaid Waiver Programs

- ▶ Called Waivers because they "waive" some of the requirements for Medicaid eligibility
- Each program has an interest list that can be several years long, so it is important to get on the lists as early as possible
- You do not have to be receiving SSI benefits to be placed in a Medicaid Waiver Program
- You can be on the waiting list for multiple programs. You can also be on the waiting list while receiving benefits from another program.
- There are over 200 "related conditions" that qualify individuals for waiver services. Spina Bifida is considered a "related condition".
- Services available through Medicaid Waiver Programs are:
 - Personal care for help with things like bathing or dressing
 - Nursing care
 - Home modifications like ramps
 - Car modifications
 - Respite care
 - Certain therapies
 - Services vary by Waiver Program. Not all services included in every program,

Medicaid Waiver Programs cont.

- Waivers that serve adults:
 - Community Living Assistance and Support Services (CLASS)
 - ▶ Gives home and community based supports to persons with a "related condition"
 - Deaf Blind with Multiple Disabilities (DBMD)
 - Services to persons who are deaf blind or have a "related condition" that leads to deaf-blindness and who have another disability
 - Home and Community Based Services (HCS)
 - Services and supports to persons with an intellectual disability or "related condition" who live with their families, in their own homes, or in small group homes
 - Texas Home Living (TxHmL)
 - Services and supports to persons with an intellectual disability or a "related condition" who I ive in their own home or their family's home.
- How to get on the interest list
 - For CLASS and DBMD, call the statewide number 1-877-438-5658 to be placed on the interest list
 - For HCS and TxHmL, call your local ADRC at 1-855-937-2372 for assistance or reach out to your Local Intellectual and Developmental Disability Authority (LIDDA)
