

- Eligibility and need based employment services
  - Prepare for employment
  - Obtain employment
  - Retain employment
  - Advance in employment
- Older Individuals who are Blind
  - Ages 55+ facing vision loss
  - Independent living

## **Youth and Student Services**

- Eligibility and need based services for students and youth
- Prepare for post-secondary education
- Prepare for employment opportunities
- Job exploration counseling
- Work-based learning experiences
- Workplace readiness training
- Instruction in self-advocacy

## Eligibility Requirements for VR Services

- Be present in the state of Texas
- Be legally eligible to work in the United States
- Have a diagnosis, medical condition or a disability which results in substantial barrier to employment
- •Require VR services to prepare for, obtain, retain or advance in employment
- •Be able to obtain, retain, or advance in employment as a result of VR services

### Who we serve

- Physical conditions
  - Medical conditions that impair a person's ability to perform daily tasks and live independently
- Mental health and neurodevelopmental conditions
  - ADHD, Anxiety, Depression, Learning Disability,
- Sensory conditions
  - Disability of hearing and/or vision loss


## **Federal Funding**

These activities are financed under the TWC Federal Vocational Rehabilitation grant. For the Federal fiscal year 2023 (October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023), TWC anticipates expending \$243,212,287 in Federal Vocational Rehabilitation funds. Funds appropriated by the State pay a minimum of 21.3% of the total costs (\$65,824,926) under the Vocational Rehabilitation program. Revised May 2023. For purposes of the Supported Employment program, the Vocational Rehabilitation agency receives 94.7 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2023 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$1,482,250. The remaining 5.3 percent (\$82,347) are funded by Texas State Appropriations. Revised May 2023. For purposes of the Independent Living Services for Older Individuals who are Blind program, the Vocational Rehabilitation agency receives 90 percent of its funding through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2022 Federal fiscal year, the total amount of grant funds awarded are \$2,202,209. The remaining 10 percent (\$244,690) are funded by Texas State Appropriations. Revised May 2023.

## Eligibility & Requirements

All Young Adults participating in the program must be between the ages of 16-24 AND meet at least one of the following barriers:

- ✓ Foster Youth
- ✓ Pregnant or Parent
- ✓ Homelessness/runaway
- ✓ High School Dropout
- ✓ Criminal background
- ✓ Disability
- ✓ Basic Skills Deficient
  - ► Males in the U.S. ages 18-25 must register for Selective Service
  - ► Call 847-688-6888 or

### Registration for Men 18-25

Selective Service registration is required by law as the first part of a fair and equitable system that, if authorized by the President and Congress, would rapidly provide personnel to the Department of Defense while at the same time providing for an Alternative Service Program for conscientious objectors. By registering, a young man remains eligible for jobs, Federal student aid, State-based student aid in 31 states, Federally-funded job training, and U.S. citizenship for immigrant men.

  - Resumé
  - **I-9**
- Paid Internship— Up to 6 weeks
- Payroll completed by Unique HR
- Minimum \$12/hr
- Job Developers will set up interviews with potential employers


